Assessing and revamping our programming in preparation for the future

The Communications and L Community Outreach (CCO) committee has for the past several months focused on assessing the state of programs and activities in various stages of development. Activities have included preparing and reviewing materials to support the development of a Youth Ambassador Program (YAP), including resources for the targeted age groups and program mapping. The YAP is a conceptualized program that would see area youth be educated on animal welfare and care practices in order to promote those concepts among

their peers. The CCO is currently considering how to advance this program and assessing ideas for distribution of the program content. Additional activities of the CCO include discussion of ways to revamp Bide Awhile's Reading Circle program and monitoring community events and tables Bide Awhile may wish to attend over the course of the next few months. The CCO has also spent time discussing the idea of animal advocacy and how it may apply to Bide Awhile and if the topic may inform the organization's strategic planning. The CCO plans to bring the topic to the wider board for discussion in 2020.

As with other committees and general shelter operations, CCO has seen its activities impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic in our province with the cancellation of events, tables and other opportunities it would normally seek out or participate in. While conditions remain uncertain, committee members continue to monitor ongoing developments with the hope of reengaging in public events as social and economic conditions normalize.
