A little extra TLC went a long way for a 10-month-old pup named Zoey

A few months ago, we received a call from a man who needed help rehoming his dog. He was unable to provide his dog, Zoey - a ten-month-old Great Pyrenees mix - with the training, activity and attention she needed as an active, still-growing pup.

When she arrived, she had her overall health assessed by our team and veterinarian. Notably, she was not spayed and lacked the confidence to stand upright or run around and play as dogs typically do; instead, she would keep close to the ground and would crawl close to the floor if and when she needed to move.

Under our care, she was vaccinated, dewormed, spayed, groomed, microchipped, and most importantly for Zoey, was socialized by our dedicated volunteers.

By receiving so much one-on-one attention from our volunteers and staff, Zoey began to rebuild her confidence and started standing a little taller. She even started to run around, play, and would roll over for a

belly rub - this was major progress for her. After several weeks, the time came when

Zoey was ready for adoption.

We got to know her true personality and the type of family that would help her thrive. Fortunately, it didn't take long before they came into the shelter, met Zoey and filled out an adoption application right away.

A few days later they picked her up, and we're told she's settling in extremely well. Her new family continues to socialize her with humans and other dogs, and have told us that she is loving the attention she's receiving, and all of the walks she's been on.

New program effective at reducing overpopulation

ne of the problems we often face at the shelter is that people will call for us to take in some kittens that their cat has had, and before they get to the shelter, they have given a couple of them away to friends and family.

When this happens, there is no guarantee that these kittens will receive the care and medical attention they need, such as vaccines, deworming, blood tests, microchipping, and being spayed or neutered.

Receiving just a few from the litter means there are still cats out there contributing to pet overpopulation.

So this summer, we tried a new approach - one that kept us extremely busy rescuing mother cats and their kittens; we offered to spay the mother cat at no cost to the owner, so long as we receive *all* of the kittens.

This way, every kitten in the litter received

the proper care they needed, but also, we can ensure participating cats and kittens would not have any unwanted litters going forward.

When they arrive at the shelter, they occupy one of our six maternity wards, and over the last few months, they have been consistently full due to the number of kittens we have been able to take in.

With the huge success of the program this summer and into the fall, we hope to continue this program next year to see that more kittens make it to our shelter, and receive proper care.

We are always striving to find new ways help care for our four-legged friends, and it is because of your support that we are able to help.
