## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Having recently lost a beloved pet, I find myself discussing the passing of pets quite frequently with people as of late and I have noticed a similar thread with everyone I come across who has also lost a pet; we all feel the same deep sadness that never really leaves us. Male, female, old, young, it does not matter. If you have lost a pet whom you loved, you are familiar with that very particular, acute pain which accompanies that loss and the grief that never really abates. I have often wondered why you can bring tears to an elderly person's eyes by talking about a pet they lost as a child or why someone will cry when looking at an old photo of a family pet. What is it about these special creatures that taps into our emotions so keenly?

I think there is great insight in this quote by Robert Brault: "The difference between friends and pets is that friends we allow into our company, pets we allow into our solitude."

This is so very true. We allow our pets into every aspect of our emotional lives and are the better for it. They do not judge us or say "I told you so". They do not make cruel remarks or mock our choices. They lie by our side and comfort us when we are sick or sad and they rejoice with us in our happiest moments. They love us unconditionally. No other relationship asks so little and returns so much.


One of the hardest things is trying to connect with others during our time of grief. Trying to explain how you feel to someone who has not been through the awful loss of a dearly-loved pet is like trying to explain tax law to a six year old. They may understand the individual words you are saying; however, the entire concept is completely lost on them. No one can truly empathize until they have experienced it themselves, so it is important not to let others dictate how you should grieve. We all do it differently and in our own time.

There are many resources to help those experiencing grief from the loss of a pet. You can find information online, comfort in support groups and advice in books. Or you may choose to honour your pet with a donation to an animal charity in their name or plant a tree in their favourite spot in your yard. Personally, I chose to place a flowering bush and engraved stone in Bide Awhile's Memorial Garden. I also volunteer at the Shelter in homage to my sweet boys, Jake and Murphy, who found their way to me through rescue groups like Bide Awhile.

And yes, adopting another pet may also help your heart to heal. Just remember that everyone in the family should be ready to accept another pet into the home. Statistically, 35% of people are still grieving the loss of a pet after six months, and 22% are still struggling a year later. A new pet will never replace your departed one, but the love and bond you will eventually share with the new pet will slowly start to heal the wounds left behind by the one who passed, and the loneliness will be replaced by new adventures, laughs and snuggles.

I am sad to report that Bide Awhile's last surviving founding member, Miss Grace Burfitt, passed away in August.

Back in 1969, Grace Burfitt joined with Mrs. Harriet Montgomery, Miss Barbara Bell, Mrs. Lorraine Kaplan, Miss Ruth Chisholm, and Miss Rosalinde Warren to launch the Bide Awhile Animal Shelter Society.

With very few resources but no end of determination, Grace and the other founding members set out to make a difference in the lives of stray and abandoned animals. And what a difference they ultimately made!

Bide Awhile began operating out of one room in Spryfield. In 1972, a mortgage was secured on a house in Dartmouth. The founding members started what is now an organization that helps at least a thousand cats, dogs, and people every year from our current shelter which was specifically built for the purpose in 2008.


