Transforming lives at Bide Awhile - one cat at a time

In March 2021 we had a cat surrendered to the care of Bide Awhile by the name of Muffy. Muffy is an adorable, black and white cat who is around eight years old. When Muffy came in, we were told that she had been recently suffering from coughing fits. With this information, we took Muffy to the vet where it was determined that she had a large hairball and mild asthma. Our fantastic vets at Eastern Passage Village Vet surgically removed Muffy's hairball and in no time, she was back at the shelter feeling better.

There is truly no better feeling than helping a sick cat to feel better and watching the transformation that follows. For Muffy, we watched her energy come back and her personality change to a loving girl who just wants to cuddle.

It is stories like this, that make us excited to come to work every day and do our job – helping to save the lives of animals in need.





It takes a village: Happy endings in our Long-Term Foster/Palliative Care Program

Bide Awhile has been busy since last Fall. From November to April Jennifer Taylor, our Animal Care Manager, and her team: brought 116 animals into our shelter; adopted 122; and subsidized 240 low-cost spay and neuter procedures by our veterinary partner, Eastern Passage Village Veterinary Hospital. Bide Awhile also added five cats to its Long-Term Foster/Palliative Care Program. In 2019, Jennifer initiated this program to remove medical costs as a barrier to adoption when we find the right fit for one of our residents.

Statistics provide an overview of our activities, but every number tells a story. Let me share one with you.

Michin, a 13-year-old orange tabby, arrived at Bide Awhile in February.

Michin was significantly overweight joint pain and reduced mobility. Routine bloodwork led our veterinarian to diagnose Hemobart. They also identified extensive dental work was needed. Gabapentin was prescribed to ease Michin's pain. He required regular bloodwork while at Bide Awhile and dental work had to be postponed until his Hemobart resolved. Michin was placed in Long-Term Foster/Palliative Care Program. Generous support from our donors enabled this program to cover \$838 of veterinary costs for Michin, both at the shelter and in his new foster home. The program also covers Michin's ongoing long term pain medication.

I am pleased to report that Michin is thriving in his new home with his

foster mom, Dawn. She reports his mobility has increased significantly, likely because of reduced pain due to medication and weight loss. Thanks to Bide Awhile's Animal Care team, Michin's foster mom - Dawn, Eastern Passage Village Veterinary Hospital and our supporters - together you all made this happy ending possible!
